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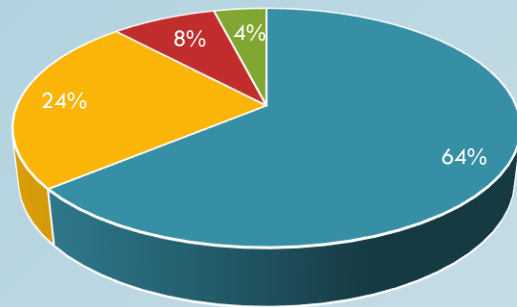

Ethnic Composition

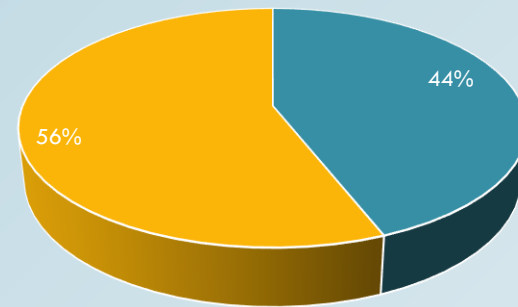
Ethnic Composition

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School Services

Guidance Network

The school has an extensive Guidance Network set up to provide pastoral support and encouragement to our students to ensure that we provide the best learning opportunities available. This includes Learning Coaches, Kaitiaki, 24/7 Youth Workers, Guidance Counsellors, Academic Deans and a Careers Adviser.



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School Services

Learning Coaches

If the problem is a day-to-day or minor one, it is likely to be dealt with by a learning coach. Their main role is pastoral care and tracking academic achievement. They see students every day and are able to assist and mentor students with information, advice and goal-setting.



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School Services

Kaitiaki

All students are placed in a House, with 10 learning hubs per House. Each House has a Kaitiaki. Their job is to be a 'guardian' of our school culture and to nurture school values through strong pastoral care. They work with students who may be 'at risk' in terms of their academic and pastoral outcomes



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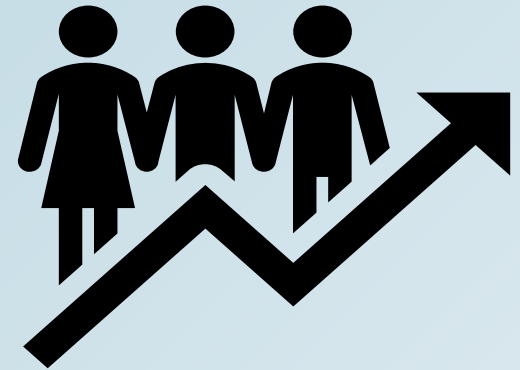


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School Services

Deans

There is a Dean at each year level. Deans help students choose their courses of study, place students in classes and deal with any academic or administrative matters. The International Dean will help to plan each International student's pathway and their pastoral care.



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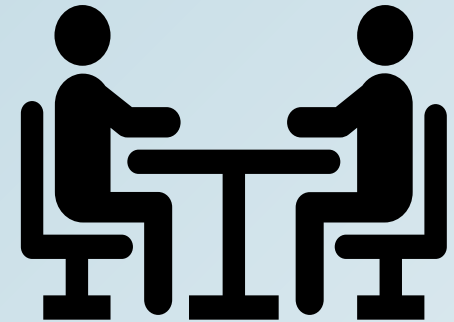


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School Services

Guidance Counsellors

The College has one full-time and one part-time Guidance Counsellor on the Staff. These people are able to offer confidential assistance to students with any matter of personal concern. We also have contact with outside agencies who counsel in different languages



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School Services

International Buddies

All International Students are assigned a 'buddy' who will meet with them regularly and help them to settle into the life of the school, assist with homework and support their classwork



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School Services

Careers Adviser

The College has a Careers Adviser who will help students with career and study information and subject choices. There are also courses available to students to participate in, tutored by outside providers, which help students with career training and decision-making.



Learning Assistance

There is extra assistance available from specialist staff for students who require additional assistance with their learning. This will be at an extra cost for International Students



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School Services

Library

We have a very well-stocked Library which is available to students until 4:30pm every day.



Computer Suites

There are a number of laptops available for International Students' use. The College has five specialist computer suites. Students are expected to provide their own laptop as the school delivers blended/hybrid learning



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Year- Level Structures

- **Morrinsville College believes that all students should have a broad general education. Our courses of learning are designed to see that this occurs.**
- **Assessment for Year 9 and Year 10 students is mostly internal. Some students may be entered for NCEA Level 1 Numeracy and Literacy credits.**
- **Years 11, 12 and 13 students enter for the New Zealand Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) from Level 1 to Level 3. The flexibility of the NCEA qualification means that it is very common for students to be working at different NCEA levels in any year. The Senior Deans guide students into these courses, after consultation with other staff.**



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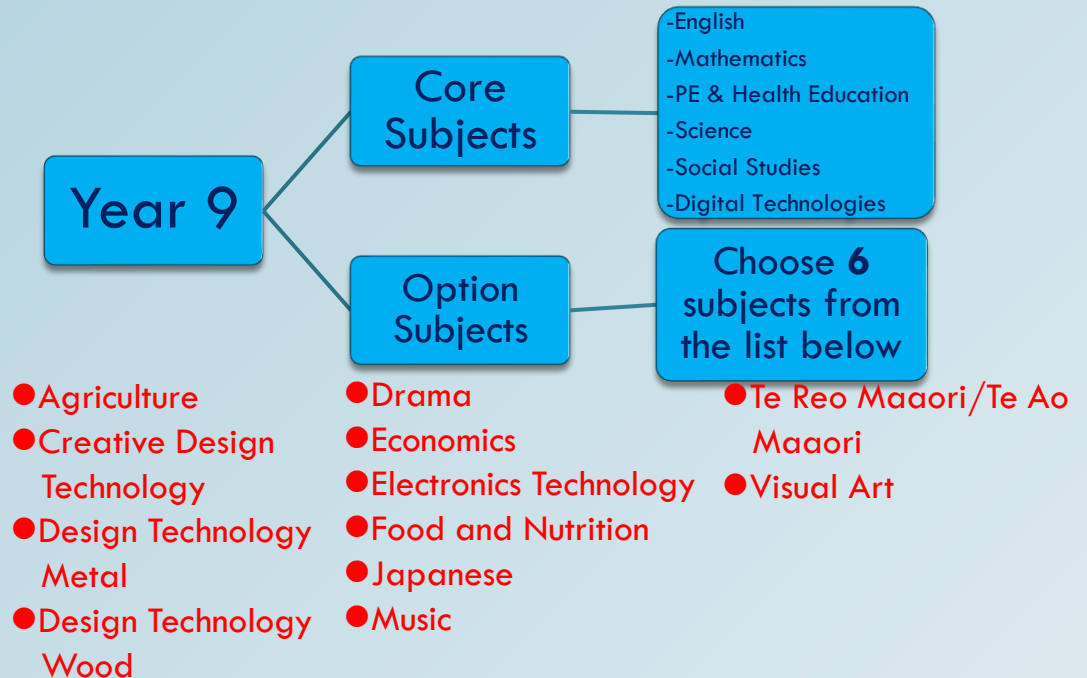

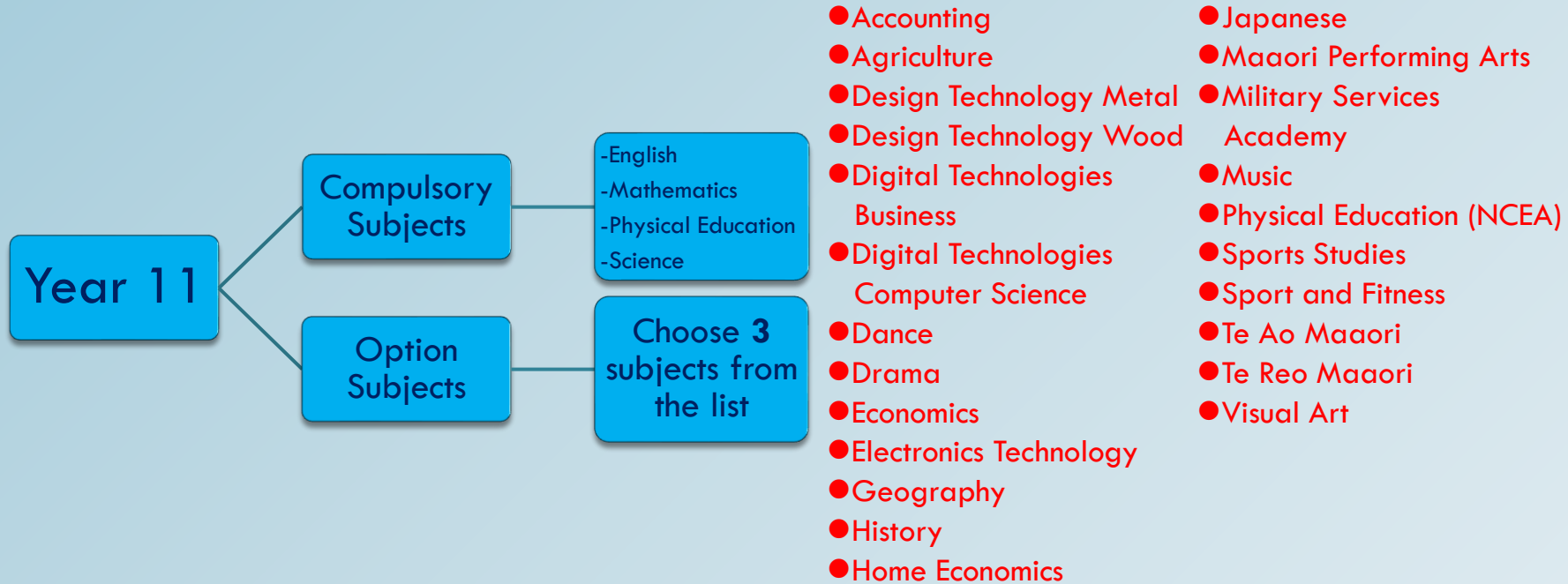

Year 11 Structure (15-16 years old)

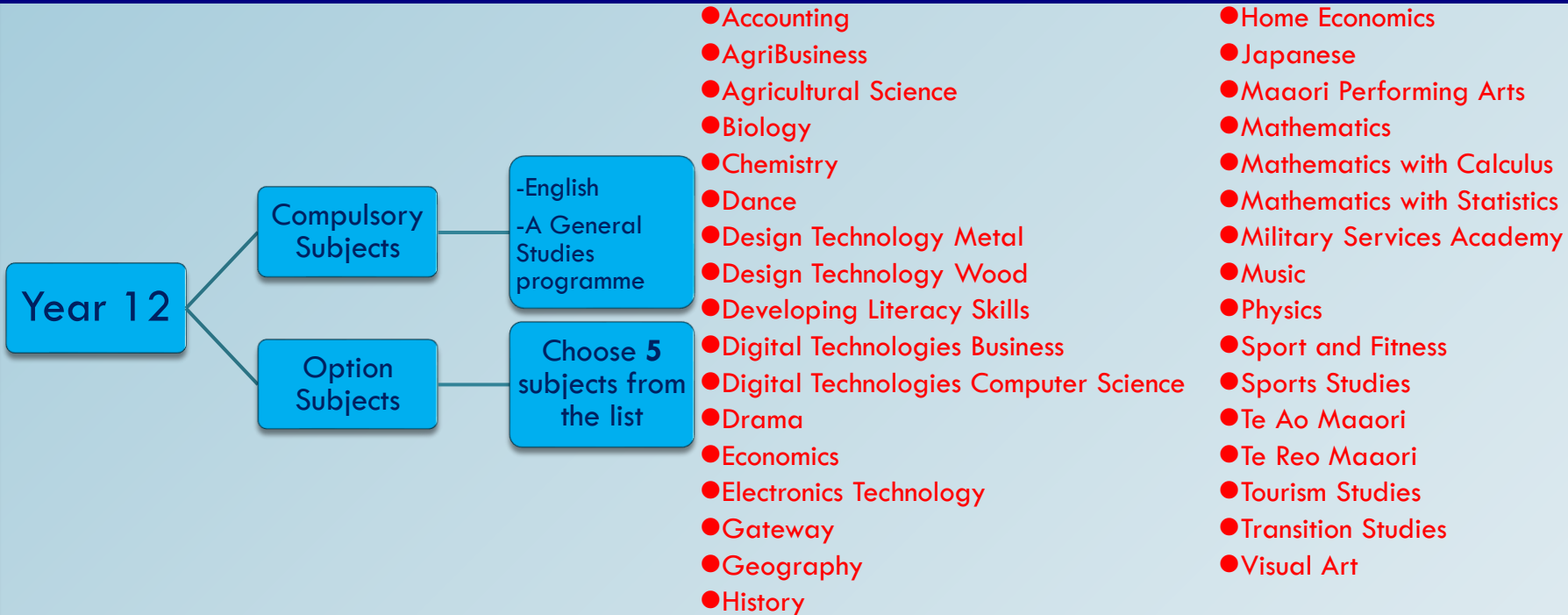




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Year-Level Structures

Year 12 Structure (16-17 years old)



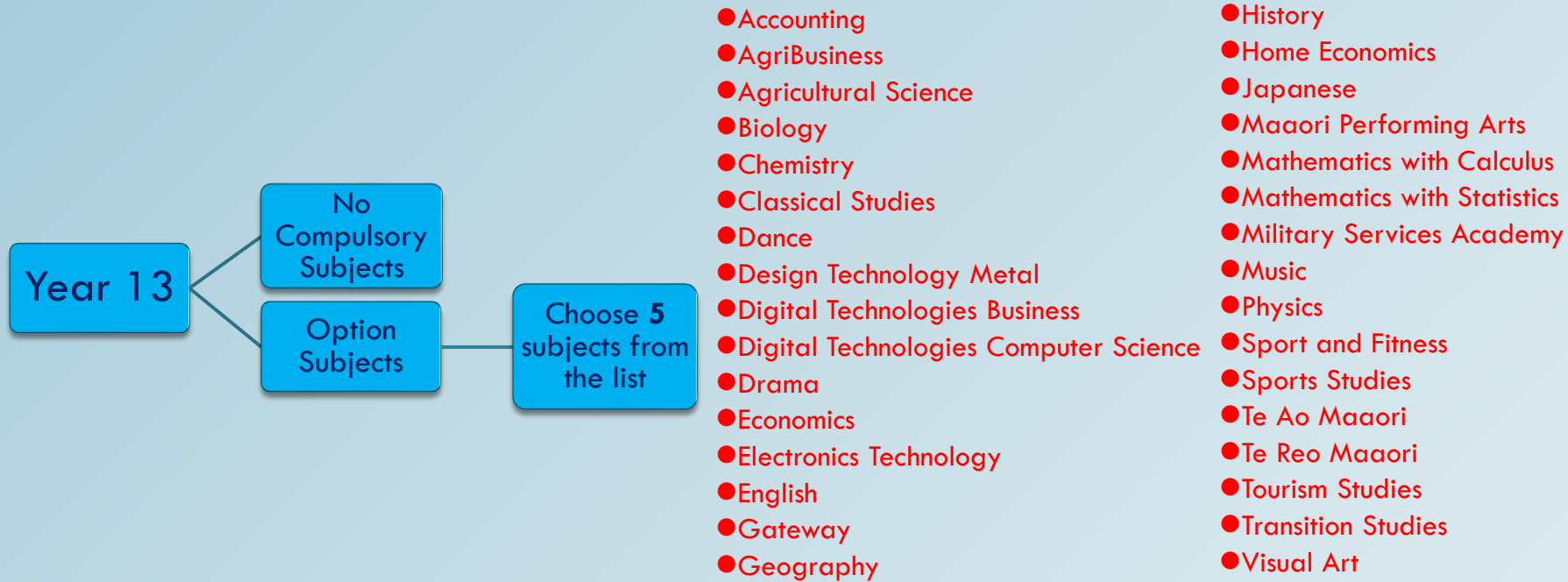

Year 13 Structure (17-18 years old)



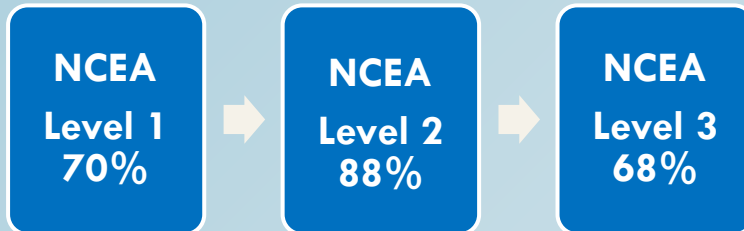


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School Success
