



Morrinsville College 'Phones Away for the Day'



Your phone must stay turned off in your bag from 8.45 am - 3.05 pm.

Inappropriate use at school may look like:

Using my phone during class time and break times.

Getting my phone out after a teacher has asked me to put it away.

Taking photos or videos without teacher permission.

Using my phone to listen to music.

Step 1: Students will be reminded regularly that their phones must be turned off and in their bags.

Step Two

- Put the phone in a named envelope
- Phone is taken to the office with a student pass
- Office will record in a book for security and phone is stored in the school safe
- Return to class with a slip from the office
- Recorded on Kamar
- Alert sent to parents/whanau

The student will be able to collect the phone at the end of the day from the DP on duty.

Step Three

- Put the phone in a named envelope
- Phone is taken to the office with a student pass
- Office will record in a book for security and phone is stored in the school safe
- Return to class with a slip from the office
- Recorded on Kamar
- Alert sent to parents/whanau
- DP on duty will monitor repeat offences

The phone can be collected by a parent or caregiver at the end of the day.

Step Four

- Put the phone in a named envelope
- Taken to the office with a student pass
- Office will record in a book for security and phone is stored in the school safe
- Return to class with a slip from the office
- Recorded on Kamar
- Alert sent to parents/whanau
- DP on duty will monitor repeat offences

The phone can only be collected by a parent or caregiver at the end of the day. A hui is arranged with the student, parents, whanau and their Manukura

Serious Misconduct

If students refuse to hand in their phones, then the matter will be referred to our Deputy Principals and treated as an issue of defiance.
At this step, this is considered to be continual disobedience which could lead to further consequences..
