FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Start of the Year

In general, we have had a much better start to the year than we did in 2020. Clearly, by this time last year COVID was beginning to rear its head overseas, but we also had some more serious student behavioural issues occurring at school. It

is pleasing that this year's cohort of Year 9 students seems to be settling in very well, as it seems are other students new to the school.

One of the things that we are concerned about currently however is that there are a few students who think that it is 'cool' to come to school without bringing a school bag, so that they do not bring a laptop to use in their classes (which is very frustrating for their teachers), they do not bring paper and pens as basic equipment, and, most significantly they do not bring any lunch. It is really important for young minds to be fed with good 'brain food' in order to enable them to learn. Not surprisingly, the ones not bringing lunch to school are often struggling with their concentration, behaviour and their learning. I ask parents to take a stand with their sons and daughters if they are refusing to bring their lunch to school each day, to ensure that this happens. It is also vital now that every student has a laptop in their bag because blended learning (including digital learning then) is very much part of day-to-day teaching at our school in all subject areas. This also helps to prepare our young people for the increasingly digital world that they are part of and which will be so important when they move on from secondary school to jobs and tertiary courses.

Head Students

I am pleased to announce the head students for 2021. Our Head Girl is Holly Aitchison and our Head Boy is Shaydan Sayer. Deputy Head Girl is Jewels Wilson and Deputy Head Boy is Grant Vollebregt.

I am confident that these four people will do a fine job. Once again this year, candidates for Head Boy and Head Girl positions all received job descriptions and filled out applications, before two of our Senior Leadership Team members, two other staff members and

With 10 students - 6 girls and 4 boys putting their names forward and being interviewed, this process took all day and beyond the end of school, and then the short-listing panel had to convene for some time afterwards in order to decide the three boys and three girls who would have an opportunity to make presentations to all of the students of the school. After these presentations, which were all very different but consistently of a high standard, our Years 12 and 13 students and Staff then voted to select the head students for 2021.

I am sure that for all of those people who applied for these important positions the experience will have resulted in personal growth and an excellent insight into what is required in many job applications these days. Congratulations to all applicants.



Exploring the Fault Line

On Monday this week a group of Years 12 and 13 Geography students visited Bruce and Donna Arnold's farm at Te Puninga at very short notice when we found out that a group of scientists were doing geoscience (GNS) tests on the earthquake fault line which runs through the Arnolds' farm and directly east of Morrinsville. This work is being led by Pilar Villarmor who is the principal scientist for the paleoseismology team with GNS science, and Waikato University's involvement is led by Professor David Lowe, brother of former Learning Area Leader of Science at our school, Dr Paul Lowe.
