# FROM THE PRINCIPAL - SCOTT JENKINS



Welcome back to school life to all students, especially those who have newly arrived at Morrinsville College, and welcome too to you, their parents and caregivers.

Currently, our school roll sits at 775 students and yesterday we welcomed in over 170 Year 9 students to their first day of college life. This is the largest start-of-the-year roll in our school's history and we appreciate the

confidence that our community has shown in us with this significant roll growth over the last two years. This is without a number of students that decided not to enrol with us due to the implementation of a school zone. This also means that we will now have to consider far tighter numbers around zone balloting for the remainder of the year and for next year.

During the first term of the year our staff and students are working with the theme "wellbeing through connection" as our students return to school and with a number of students new to our area. It is really important that we get our young people moving and doing

so alongside their peers. As part of this we have moved forward our Year 9 camp this year and our brand new Year 9s will head off to Pauanui in the next two weeks.

Parents are a key part of this wellbeing strategy. If your son/daughter wants to skip PE or miss swimming sports or athletics, please encourage them participate. While some of our students have genuine barriers in this regard, just being present next to their peers can be enough. While this may be difficult as parents in the short-term, in the long-term there is growing academic and anecdotal evidence that this is critical for our young people's mental health and well-being. We need to get them 'off the couch' and participating.

#### **Contact Between Home and School**

They help our students to set goals for themselves each year and monitor progress towards these and they track each student's learning and mentor their students in their Hub. They maintain contact with you as parents, especially if there are any issues with your son/daughter. you the same day if at all possible.

Each House also has a Kaitiaki leader who plays a very important role as guardian of our school culture, dealing particularly with the pastoral needs and guidance of our students. Unless there is an emergency, please do not contact us at home - we appreciate the time that we have with our families.

The higher the percentage of attendance in class the better the learning that occurs for all students. Students' attainment of academic, cultural, social goals and their development of sound habits towards future employment are greatly enhanced. Thank you for supporting your child to attend school regularly and on time, making a huge difference to their education.

If possible, please let the school know in advance of any absence. Students late to school for any reason should supply a signed note of explanation from you, rather than phoning and leaving a message. Due to the high number of phone messages that we receive each morning it is difficult to check all messages before students start signing in late.

For any known periods of leave in term time, please obtain a note to the school Office BEFORE school so that passes can then be permission by prior application in writing to the principal.

A reminder that the school day starts at 8.45am and all students are expected to be here at that time. We encourage parents to help their children to develop routines to ensure that they are at school

# Schoolbridge

This year, to make communication a more seamless process for our families, we have introduced Schoolbridge. This will allow all communications, trip permission forms, absences and attendance, academic information, including reports and in-school alerts to go through one site. This will also allow payments to be done electronically. This will also replace Skool Loop and many of the functions of Kamar. Importantly, we deliberately selected an App that parents were able to use through their phones. A significant number of people have already set Schoolbridge

#### **Cellphone Policy**

As part of their election platform the current Government made a statement around the banning of cellphones in schools. There has been very little detail provided by the MOE to schools around this policy statement and schools have been left to develop their own interpretation of this policy. The key requirements were that all schools needed to have a cellphone policy by the end of Term 1 this year and that there was a clear intention to include break times as well as class time within this policy.

Each school has interpreted the new Government policy from quite different angles, with many taking a 'waiting' approach. We currently already have a cellphone policy which is focused on their use in class time. This policy requires all students to have their phones in their bags and out of sight during class time unless they are required to use them by their teachers for an educational

In order to extend this policy to include break times, we intend to take our time and consult our staff, students and parent community before finalising any policy change. While this will be a contentious discussion and we will never get 100% agreement, it will be very important that we find some agreement on issues such as cellphone storage and potential consequences for breaking any rules in order for this to be a sustainable and pragmatic school policy. Our staff are being consulted in the next two weeks and then we will go out to our student and parent community with a range of suggestions that we think may work in the middle of this term. Until this point our current policy remains in place and we ask parents who wish to contact their students during the day not to do so during class time. Emergencies can go through the Office who will pass this directly to the student concerned.

# **Students Requiring Passes to Leave School for Appointments**

Students requiring passes to leave school during school hours, for instance to attend a dentist's or doctor's appointment, MUST bring

# Uniform

The start of the term for all students is a timely to reminder for all students and whanau about the uniform expectations at Morrinsville College. You will find attached a link to the full College uniform requirements for our students.

We expect students to wear our uniform with pride and wear it correctly. Should a student have an incorrect uniform item they are required to see the Kaitiaki during Hub time to either get a uniform pass or alternatively borrow a uniform item to wear for the day.

We have worked hard over the last few years to ensure all students feel comfortable with the uniform and the recent addition of trousers has been well received. While this is mainly in winter uniform item we would like to highlight that the trousers are plain black dress trousers which can be purchased at Harry's Surf and Menswear store or the Warehouse. Track or sweatpants, cargo pants, cords and jeans are not considered to be dress pants.

Below are some other areas of the College uniform we wish to highlight before school starts:

#### **JEWELLERY**

- Students may wear up to 3 plain studs or sleepers in each ear
- Students may wear a single nose piercing providing that the stud is less than 3mm in size
- No other visible body or facial piercings or spacers are allowed
- One necklace can be worn of religious or cultural significance discretely.
- No other jewellery is permitted apart from wristwatches eg necklaces, bangles, ankle bracelets and rings.

#### HAIR

- Hair must be kept neat and tidy in a simple style. If necessary, hair should be tied back.
- · Hair colour should be natural, muted colours and in a style appropriate for school.
- There should be no large streaks or patches or colour, or stark, bright, contrasting colours.
- Mohawks or shaved designs are not allowed.

# **MAKEUP**

- Nails must be short and trimmed; well-applied nail polish is permitted
- Heavy makeup is not allowed.
